



## **Defining the Narrative**

Classroom Visit

Introduction to Objects Series

Great for: courses in subjects that overlap with material in collections storage.

Class Time One visit of 1-1.5 hours

Class Level Introductory to Intermediate Undergraduate

Class Size Maximum of 15 students

Objectives Conduct basic research; practice critical observation; connect primary sources to

larger themes and ideas

Prep Instructors work with AED staff to identify Museum objects that that represent

either typical and atypical examples of their type (e.g., representations of Hindu gods, Greek kylixes, Chinese woodblock prints). In pairs or trios, students select and research the broader types, generating a summary of their findings to bring

to the class visit.

Visit Students examine the objects from their type and assess how they align (or

don't) with the typology they developed before the visit. In their groups,

students present their assessment to their classmates, drawing attention to the

details of the object that fit or break with the standard.

Post Students build upon their initial research to contextualize their object through a

short essay (optional).
